Turner Theological Seminary (TTS) was established as a department on the campus of Morris Brown College. In 1900, the department was officially named Turner Theological Seminary, honoring Bishop Henry McNeal Turner who was the Presiding Prelate at that time. The seminary remained a part of Morris Brown College until it became one of the founding constituent institutions of the Interdenominational Theological Center (the ITC) in 1958.

As an affiliate institution of the African Methodist Episcopal (A.M.E.) Church at the ITC, persons desiring to meet the requirements for ministry in the A.M.E. Church are encouraged to enroll in TTS through the ITC.

At the ITC, Turner Theological Seminary students are engaged in rigorous academic studies of intellectual reflection through investigation, critical thinking, evaluation, communication and decision-making for responsible spiritual formation of self and others. Also, as a constituent seminary at the ITC, students in TTS experience "Ecumenism in Action" by interacting with students in other denominational communions through class participation, study groups, and chapel experiences.

Additionally, students become rooted and grounded in A.M.E. tradition through required courses in history and polity.

Online Distance Learning Program

To accommodate working students, classes at the ITC can be taken during the day, evenings, and on weekends, as well as ITC's Master of Divinity Online Distance Learning Program. This Program allows students to take up to 48 hours of the 90 credit hour M.Div. Program online, via an Internet connection. Online means that students are able to access the M.Div. Program from wherever there is high speed Internet access anywhere in the world.

Due to the increasing use of technology in higher education, ITC's Graduate Studies utilizes Internet resources for all academic programs. Student success is based on accessibility to a computer with Internet service.

Admission Requirements For Turner Theological Seminary at the ITC

- Completion of Admission Application and three recommendation forms
- An endorsement from the Presiding Bishop of the applicant's Episcopal District
- Transcripts and/or honorable withdrawal from any previous institution of higher education.
- A bachelors degree from an accredited college or university with a grade point average (GPA) of 2.25 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent.
- President/Dean's approval

Upon the approval of the Admission's Committee, provisional admission status may be considered for certain students meeting both life experience and academic qualifications under the Degree Equivalency category if they

have at least seven (7) years of significant, broadly-based leadership experience in a local church and participation in community activities as a volunteer or professional worker.
